Events organized by Literary Sub-Council, USAC HBTU during Session 2022-23

Discord Sessions (7, 9, 14, 16, 21 June 2022)

The mega event comprised of four committees namely,

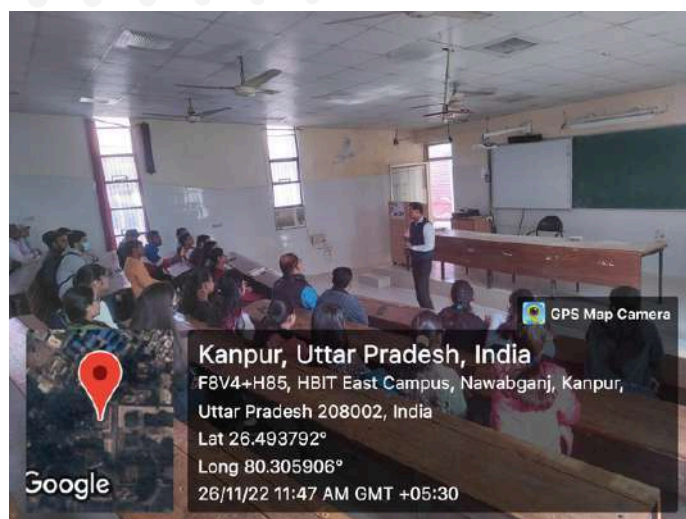
CONSTITUTION DAY (26 NOV 2022)

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Bharatiya Bhasha Utsav was celebrated in HBTU under the aegis of the Literary Sub- Council, USAC HBTU.

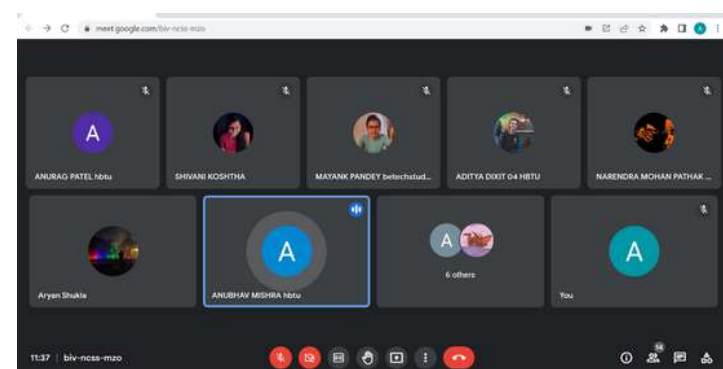
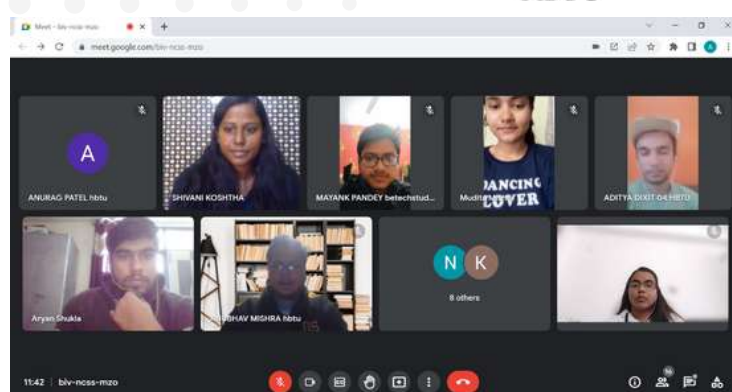
An online Google Meet was organised on December 11, 2022, in which students from different branches actively participated in the group discussion.

ROTA Sessions (3, 15 December 2022)

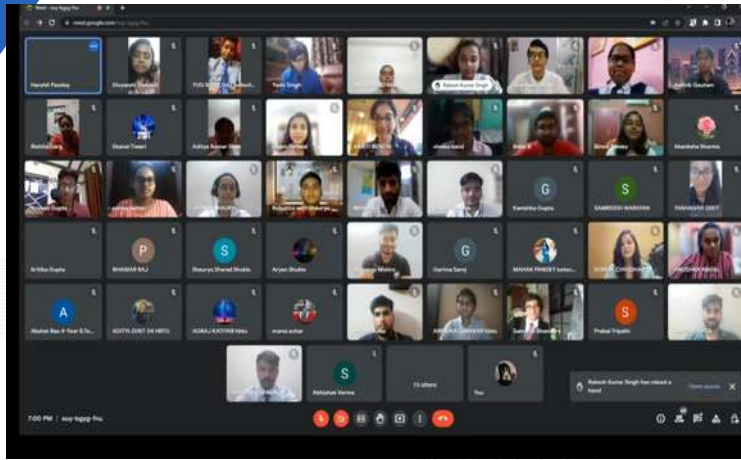

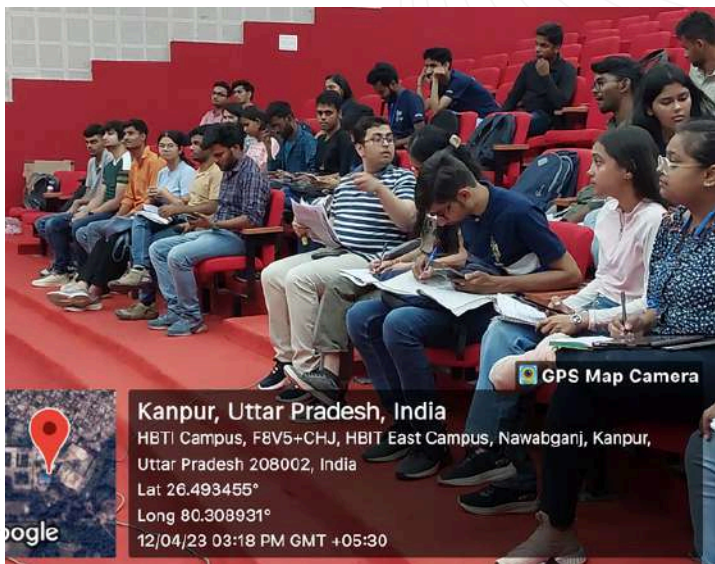

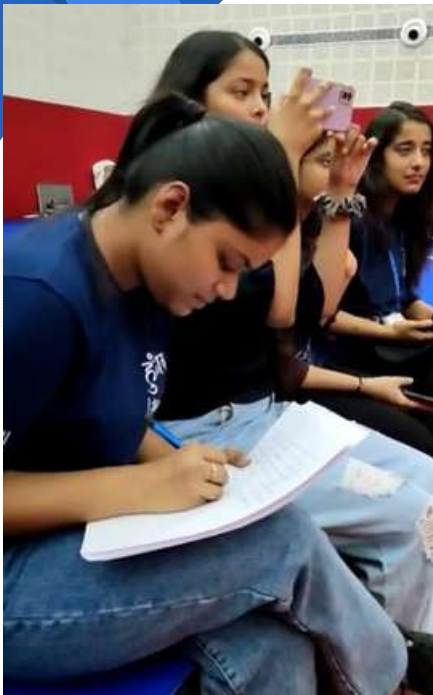
Youth Parliament (12th April 2023)

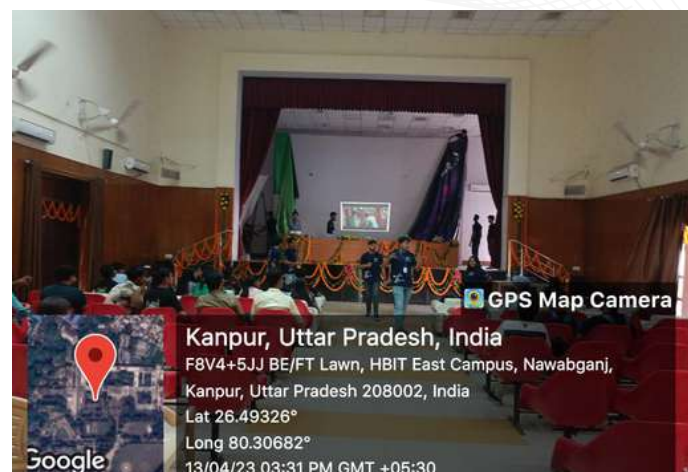
Debate-A-Thon (13th April 2023)

All the faculty members address students about the life of our Father of the Constitution and how tough it was for him to survive and gain that much knowledge with all the difficulties.

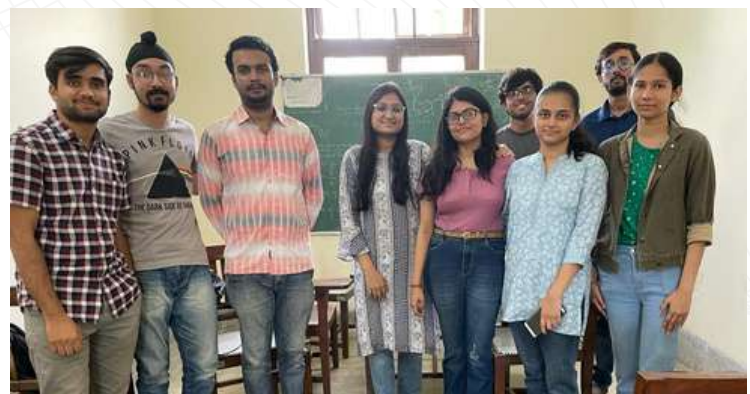


Debating Workshop (1st May 2023)
