





LECTURE ON NOBLE PRIZE WINNER C V RAMAN AND EXHIBITION BY HBTU STUDENTS

A bit from where it all started was when Professor Raman got interested in researching about this phenomenon on his trip to Europe. In 1921, he got curious to know the reason behind the blue colour of the Mediterranean Sea. This led him to conduct various experiments with transparent surfaces, ice blocks and light. He then observed a change in wavelength after light passed through ice cubes.

The theme of National Science Day 2022 is 'Integrated Approach in Science and Technology for Sustainable Future.' The day will be marked by celebrations across educational institutions, public speeches, science exhibitions, debates etc.

To successfully follow the theme of National Science Day, HBTU also organized a science exhibition in which various new models were displayed by students from various departments making this day a complete success.

5. World Environment Day, 5th June 2021




